

Exempt Teacher Pay Minimum Calculation Worksheet for Private School Organizations

<u>Step 1:</u> Identify the *public school district* and *County Office of Education* in which your private school resides

Step 2: Calculate 70% of the lowest salary offered to a credentialed teacher (BA+30) in the district

Salary Schedule likely located on district webpage

- 1. Identify the Certificated Teacher Salary Schedule for the public school district
- 2. Locate the lowest salary offered to a credentialed teacher at the "BA+30" level on the public district Certificated Teacher Scale
- 3. Multiply this figure by .7 (representing 70%) and enter it in worksheet box A

Step 3: Calculate 70% of the lowest salary offered to a credentialed teacher (BA+30) across the county

Use the spreadsheet made available on the CAPSO website (click here) for the following steps.

- 1. Find the County Office of Education in which your school resides on the spreadsheet
- 2. Use the spreadsheet to identify the lowest qualifying salary (chart courtesy of CAPSO) in COE
- 3. Identify the 70% value of this salary (furthest right column)
- 4. Enter this figure in worksheet box B

<u>Step 4:</u> In <u>Worksheet Box C</u>, enter the *lowest verified statewide salary* offered to a fully-credentialed public school teacher at the "B.A. + 30" level

This figure is calculated as a courtesy for private schools in California by CAPSO.

For the 2023-2024 school year this figure is \$36,507

Minimum Threshold Worksheet:

Box A (from Step 2)	
Box B (from Step 3)	
Box C (from step 4)	\$36,507 (updated January 22, 2024)

<u>Step 4:</u> Select the lesser of Worksheet Box A or Box B, as long as it Exceeds Worksheet Box C. If Worksheet Boxes A and B are less than Worksheet Box C, use Box C to meet the minimum salary threshold.
